

"Every boy that is born you must throw into the Nile, but let every girl live."


Now a man of the house of Levi married a Levite woman,

The next day he went out there again and saw two Hebrews fighting.


"Why are you hitting your fellow Hebrew? You are brothers!"

I will grant this people favor in the sight of the Egyptians; so that when you leave, you will not go empty-handed.


Moses answered,

# 9. Ten plagues of Egypt (Exodus 8:16~12:36)

Pharaoh promised that he would let Israelites go if the frogs are gone. But he didn't keep his promise. So the third plague came upon them.

"My king! This is the anger of God. Just let them leave!" "No! I would never do that!"

Then the LORD said to Moses,

But on that day, I will deal differently with the land of Goshen, where my people live; no swarms of flies will be there,

Then Pharaoh promised that he would let Israelites go if the flies are gone. But this time also Pharaoh didn't keep his promise.

"Moses! Aaron! Take handfuls of soot from a furnace and have Moses toss it into the air in the presence of Pharaoh. It will become fine dust over the whole land of Egypt, and festering boils will break out on men and animals throughout the land."

But Pharaoh would not listen to Moses and Aaron.

"Moses, get up early in the morning, confront Pharaoh and say to him. This time I will send the worst hailstorm that has ever fallen on Egypt, from the day it was founded till now. Give an order now to bring the livestock and everything in the field to the house, because the hail will fall on every man and animal that has not been brought in and is still out in the field, and they will die.' "

Just like the LORD said, hail fell, and lightning flashed back and forth. It was the worst storm in all the land of Egypt since it had become a nation.


Throughout Egypt hail struck everything in the fields--both men and animals; it beat down everything growing in the fields and stripped every tree. The only place it did not hail was the land of Goshen, where the Israelites were.

Now the LORD had said to Moses,

"I will bring one more plague on Pharaoh and in Egypt. After that, he will let you go from here, and when he does, he will drive you out completely.

Tell the people that men and women alike are to ask their neighbors for articles of silver and gold. "

Moses went to Pharaoh.

"This is what the LORD says, every firstborn son in Egypt will die, from the firstborn son of Pharaoh, who sits on the throne, to the firstborn son of the slave girl, and all the firstborn of the cattle as well. There will be loud wailing throughout Egypt. But among the Israelites not a dog will bark at any man or animal. All these officials of yours will come to me, bowing down before me and saying, 'Go, you and all the people who follow you!' After that I will leave."

The Israelites went slaughter the lamb and with its blood, put some of it on the top and on both sides of the doorframe. That night, they ate the meat roasted over the fire, along with bitter herbs, and bread made without yeast. With their cloak tucked into their belt, their sandals on their feet and their staff in their hand. They are it in hurry. At midnight, the plague will pass seeing the blood on the top and sides of the doorframe. Except them, The LORD struck down all the firstborn in Egypt, there was loud wailing in Egypt, for there was not a house without someone dead.

Then tell them, 'It is the Passover sacrifice to the Lord, who passed over the houses of the Israelites in Egypt and spared our homes when he struck down the Egyptians.'" Then the people bowed down and worshiped. (Exodus 12:27)

"My king, your son, prince is dead."

During the night Pharaoh summoned Moses and Aaron and said,

"Up! Leave my people, you and the Israelites! Now! "

The people of Egypt wanted the Israelites to go as soon as possible. So they gave everything they required.

"Give us the articles of silver and gold and for clothing of yours."

There were about six hundred thousand men on foot, besides women and children. The Israelite people lived in Egypt for 430 years. At the end of the 430 years, to the very day, they left Egypt. God led the people around by the desert road toward the Red Sea.

"By day the LORD makes a pillar of cloud so within its shade, it's not too hot."

"By night a pillar of fire protects us so that we could go forward."



"God keep us day and night and lead us so we could travel safely."

Then the LORD said to Moses,

"Tell the Israelites to turn back and encamp near Pi Hahiroth, Pharaoh will think, 'The Israelites are wandering around the land in confusion, hemmed in by the desert.' And I will harden Pharaoh's heart, and he will pursue you. But I will gain glory for myself through Pharaoh and all his army, and the Egyptians will know that I am the LORD."

Just like he said, Pharaoh changed his mind. Pharaoh said to his servant,

On the sixth day they are to prepare what they bring in, and that is to be twice as much as they gather on the other days."

"In the evening you will know that it was the LORD who brought you out of Egypt, and in the morning, you will see the glory of the LORD, because he has heard your grumbling against him. Who are we, that you should grumble against us?"



Moses also said,

"You will know that it was the LORD when he gives you meat to eat in the evening and all the bread you want in the morning, because he has heard your grumbling against him. You are not grumbling against us, but against the LORD."

Then Moses told Aaron.

"Aaron! Say to the entire Israelite community, 'Come before the LORD, for he has heard your grumbling.' " While Aaron was speaking to them, they looked toward the desert, and there was the glory of the LORD appearing in the cloud.

That evening quail came and covered the camp, and in the morning, there was a layer of dew around the camp. When the dew was gone, thin flakes like frost on the ground appeared on the desert floor.

When the Israelites saw it, they didn't know what it was. Moses said to them.

"It is the bread the LORD has given you to eat. Each one is to gather as much as he needs. Take an omer which is two liters for each person you have in your tent. "

The Israelites did as they were told; some gathered much, some little.

And when they measured it, each one gathered as much as he needed.

"No one is to keep any of it until morning."



However, some of them paid no attention to Moses; they kept part of it until morning, but it was full of maggots and began to smell. So Moses was angry with them.

On the sixth day, they gathered twice as much

"Tomorrow is to be a day of rest, a holy Sabbath to the LORD. So bake what you want to bake and boil what you want to boil. Save whatever is left and keep it until morning."

So they saved it until morning, as Moses commanded, and it did not stink or get maggots in it.

"Eat it today, because today is a Sabbath to the LORD. You will not find any of it on the ground today."


Nevertheless, some of the people went out on the seventh day to gather it, but they found none. Then the LORD said to Moses,


