Sermon

The people of Israel worked hard. They were slaves in Egypt. So, they prayed to God every day. "God, please save us, help us. It's too hard!" God heard their prayers and saved the Israelites from Egypt. When the Israelites finally escaped from Egypt, God even helped them cross the sea. But when the Egyptian soldiers chased after them and tried to cross the sea too, they all drowned.

After crossing the Red Sea, the Israelites entered the wilderness. When they struggled in the wilderness, God guided them with a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night. Finally, they arrived at Mount Sinai.

Moses said, "Everyone, let's set up camp here." Moses led the Israelites to set up their tents there. And in that place, God's word was heard. "Moses, tell the people of Israel this: You have experienced how I brought you out of Egypt. You are my special people. You will become a kingdom of priests and will do special work." Moses shared what God had said with the Israelites. "Everyone, God has chosen us to be His special people. He said that we will become a kingdom of priests and do special work for Him. God wants the whole world to know Him through us."

God says the same thing to us today. This place is the world we live in. There are many different people living here—some are older than us, and many are friends just like us. But among all these people, God says that I am the most special. Why does God say that I am special? Is it because I'm smart? Or because I'm pretty or handsome? Or because I sing well?

The reason I am special is not because of how I look or how smart I am, but because of God's special grace that made me His child. God has given special grace to us, His children. That grace is to glorify God. To glorify God means to love Him and feel His presence. And there is special work we must do—blessing the world. To bless the world means helping others know God and helping them in their lives.

I hope that all of us can glorify God and become friends who bless the world.

Sermon

The title of today's sermon is "I Have a Purpose". Hello, my friends! In Lesson 1, we learned that God has chosen us, and we are special. Now, in Lesson 2, we are going to learn that God created us with a purpose.

Where are we now? This is our home. In our home, there are many different things. *Swish, swish*—what is this? That's right, it's a broom! Why was the broom made for? Yes, to sweep up the crumbs left from the snacks you eat and to clean up the dust. It's a very helpful friend that keeps our house clean. Now, what about this? *Whirr, whirr*—what is this that gives us cool air? That's right, it's a fan! It cools us down on hot days when we are sweating. And what's next? *Whirl, whirt*—what is this? Yes, it's a washing machine. Why was the washing machine made? Yes, it's a friend that cleans our dirty clothes.

All the things in our home have a reason for being made. That reason is called a purpose. But is it only these things that have a purpose? No! God has a purpose for creating us too. So, what is the purpose for which God made us? Let's find out through our Bible story today.

God spoke to Moses. "I will come down to meet the people at Mount Sinai. Have the people prepare themselves to meet Me." As God commanded, the people cleansed their bodies and hearts. Just like how you clean your bodies and wear clean clothes when you come to church, the Israelites also cleaned their bodies and hearts.

The appointed day arrived, and Mount Sinai was covered in clouds. *Boom, boom*—there was thunder, and *trumpets sounded loudly*. The people were trembling in fear. Moses led them to the foot of the mountain. Then, God descended in fire on Mount Sinai. The mountain was filled with smoke and began to shake. *The trumpet sound grew louder and louder*. God commanded the people not to come too close, and He spoke from Mount Sinai: "I am the Lord your God who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery." Then God gave them the Ten Commandments.

What did God want to teach the Israelites through the Ten Commandments? He showed them the purpose they should live by. And what was that purpose? Ta-da! To **glorify God and bless the world**. To glorify God means to love and honor Him. To bless the world means to love others and help them know God. The Israelites were to live by glorifying God and blessing the world, because that was God's purpose for saving them.

What did God show the Israelites through the Ten Commandments? He showed them the purpose of their lives—to glorify God and bless the world. And God has given the same purpose to us! "So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God" (1 Corinthians 10:31). Amen.

That's right! We must live for God's glory and to bless the world. Now, let's remember our purpose for God: "**Glorify God, bless the world!**" My friends, we must live with the purpose of glorifying God and blessing the world. This will make God very happy! Let's all say it together: "**Glorify God, bless the world!**"

Sermon

My friends, today we are going to learn about the work God has entrusted to us, and how we should fulfill God's work before Him, the One who created everything. Let's follow along with me. Raise your hands! Can you sparkle your hands? These hands can do sparkling dance moves, exercises, and can grab anything. Now move your feet. Your feet help you walk on the ground and go anywhere. Now move your arms above your shoulders. Your hands and arms are doing different movements. Try moving your belly—how fun! Let's twist our waists. Each part of the body is doing different exercises based on where it is. Wow, God made us so wonderfully, giving us such healthy bodies. Now, move your head—see, it's a different movement again! Our bodies are designed so that each part has its own job. Our hands can't do what our feet do. God created our bodies in such a way that our hands do what hands are supposed to do, and feet do what feet are supposed to do. Even if feet want to do what the hands do, they simply can't.

In the same way, God sees each one of us as precious and has made us special, giving us each a task that we are able to do. So, we shouldn't think, "I want to do what someone else is doing! They can't do what I can do!" That's a selfish thought. We need to be thankful for the grace God has given us, just as we are. Now, let's dive into the Bible. This is a story about the people of Israel.

When Moses approached God, God spoke to him: "Let the Levites take care the tabernacle." What did God say? Yes, He assigned the Levites to work in the tabernacle. What is the tabernacle? It is the place where the people worshipped God and met with Him. The tabernacle was a place where the people of Israel offered their gifts to God and encountered Him. God instructed the Israelites to build this tabernacle so He could meet with them and so they could keep His commands. He also gave the Levites the responsibility of doing the work in the tabernacle.

There was a man named Levi, and he had three sons: Kohath, Gershon, and Merari. God gave the descendants of Kohath, Gershon, and Merari different tasks to do in the tabernacle. When the Israelites moved from place to place, the tabernacle had to move with them. So, God assigned the responsibility of moving the tabernacle to each of the Levite families. He also commanded Aaron the priest and his sons, "When the tabernacle is moved, cover all the holy things in the sanctuary." The holy objects in the sanctuary were not to be touched or

seen by just anyone. So, God gave Aaron and his sons the task of preparing and covering these items in the sanctuary. This was a special task that only they could do. Once the priests had finished their preparation, the other Levites would carry the objects, just as God had commanded.

God gave specific instructions: "The Kohathites will carry all the holy objects that Aaron and his sons have covered. The Gershonites will carry the curtains, coverings, and ropes of the tabernacle. The Merarites will carry the frames, pillars, and bases of the tabernacle." Each family did their assigned task. Aaron and his sons made sure the other Levites did their work properly. Everyone did the unique task God had given them to do.

My dear friends, we are all different, just like the Levites. Each of us has different strengths, and some people may not yet realize how special they are. But never forget that God made you special! So, don't compare yourself to others or feel upset. Don't be envious of what others do. Always remember that God has given you a task that only you can do. God sees each one of you as precious and the work He has given you is just as precious. Let's say it together: "I have a special task to do!" Well done! Now repeat after me: "I am used by God, and God has given me my own special work!"

Sermon

My friends, look at this beautiful heart. How do you express a heart? Like this, and like this, right? When you love someone, you want to give them a nice gift. When you love someone, you might even want to give them everything you have. God created our hearts that way. Today, we're going to hear about the Israelites, who loved God so much that they wondered, "What can we give to God?" Let's dive into the Bible to find out.

Moses led the Israelites and constantly reminded them of who God is and how He speaks to us. Look at this picture—it shows the tabernacle. What is the tabernacle? In old times, it was the place where people met with God. The Israelites made the tabernacle so they could worship and meet with God while they traveled in the wilderness. It was a place where they offered sacrifices and lifted their faith to God. One day, God gave instructions about the tabernacle. He said, "Have the people prepare and make the tabernacle, the objects inside it, and the clothes for the priests." Ah, this means that to meet God, the first thing we need to do is offer our hearts to Him. Moses told all of this to the people.

Many of the Israelites were so happy to help build the tabernacle, where they would worship and meet God. Moses told them what was needed: "To make the tabernacle, we need shining jewels, thread, leather, and fragrant oil. We need to offer these things to God. Let's do it together!" The people didn't grumble or hesitate, because they were giving to the God they loved. Something amazing happened. You might think that some people would have been reluctant, but when Moses said, "Give your offerings to build the tabernacle," many people joyfully brought their precious belongings to God. Some people brought jewels from their homes, others brought precious fragrant oil, and others brought carefully prepared leather because they wanted to give it to God. How beautiful and wonderful were their hearts! They weren't giving out of obligation—they gave because they loved God and wanted to. Can you imagine how happy God must have been to see the Israelites bringing their gifts out of love for Him?

God also appointed skilled people to help build the tabernacle. He chose Bezalel to use his talents to make worship items from the jewels. "I'm skilled with my hands, so I will use my talents for God!" What a great person! God also appointed Oholiab to weave the fabric and make beautiful clothes for the tabernacle. "The skills in my hands are a gift from God, so even my small abilities are more beautiful when I give them to God!" I hope that, like the

Israelites, you can also use not only the things you have but also the talents God has given you for Him.

Sounds of work echoed everywhere. The Israelites, following Bezalel and Oholiab, worked hard to build the tabernacle. They wanted to use all their hands and feet to serve God and meet with Him. We too should offer our hands and feet to God in worship. The Israelites kept bringing more and more with joyful hearts to give to God. So much was brought that Moses finally said, "Stop! We now have more than enough. Thank you so much, everyone! You are amazing!" The Israelites had offered the most precious things they had to God, so much that Moses had to ask them to stop. This was all by God's grace. They gave because they truly loved God. When you love God, offering your belongings to Him doesn't feel like a loss, and there's no reluctance—it's a joy because you're giving to Him.

My friends, just like the Israelites, let's be people who give to God joyfully and from the heart. One friend is saying, "God, use me!" Let's say it together: "God, I offer myself to You. Use me for Your purposes!" Be the kind of person who shouts to God like this. When we offer ourselves to God, He will be so pleased and happy, looking at us with a smile.

Let's pray: "God, I offer my life to You. Use me. I want to bring You joy. Help me to remember this until I grow up. Please use me. Use me for Your glory."

Game: A gift or snack grab game - Hang gifts or snacks on a string, and the kids will run, jump, and try to grab them

Craft: Fold a gift box out of paper and write down your commitment (optional: candy necklace)

Now let's remember what we've learned so far

(1) First, God has a plan for us, and He saved us through Jesus. He made us His own and gave us the task of serving Him and making Him known to the world, which makes us special.

(2) God chose us, His special people, and gave us the purpose of glorifying Him and being a blessing to the world.

(3) We have learned that there is a unique task for each of us to do in order to glorify God and bless the world.

(4) God desires us to offer ourselves to Him, and we have decided to give ourselves to God.

Now, let's hold on to this truth in our hearts and live it out!

Let's shout together the theme of this Bible School

"God, use me!"
